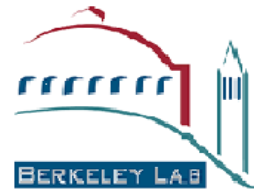
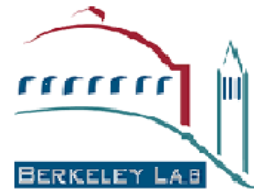

Lead Safety

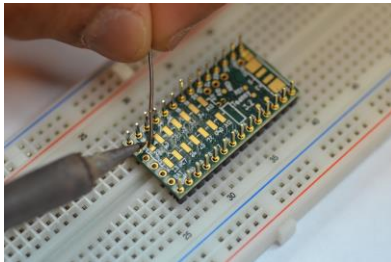


Certain routine lead work is covered by the lab's Negative Exposure Assessments (NEA)

An NEA is a written statement indicating that a specific lead-disturbing job does not result in worker exposure above the Action Level.

Two common jobs covered by NEAs are:

- Soldering

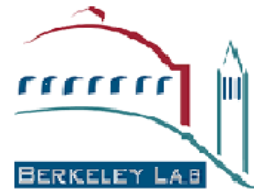


- Handling less than or equal to 5 bricks a day



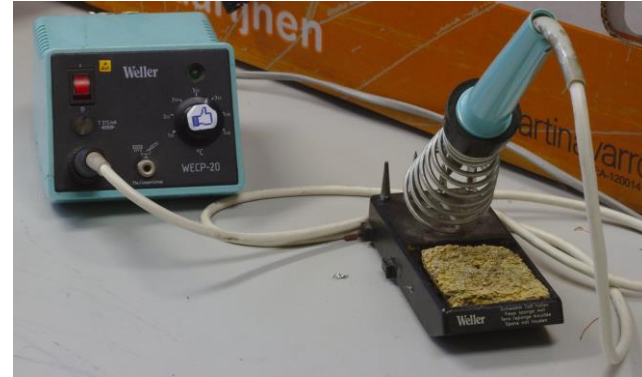
Each has a WPC hazard that must be listed on your activity before you can perform the work.

Lead Safety



Soldering

- Nonproduction
- Benchtop operation
- Wash your hands after



Lead Bricks

- 5 or less bricks, or an equivalent amount of lead
- Handle carefully
- Hold out from body, or wear disposable PPE
- Wear gloves and wash hands after
- **MUST** be visible clean or covered!!
