Implicit Bias





When a stereotype dumbfounds: Probing the nature of the surgeon = male belief^{\star}

- 82% of Americans failed to report that the surgeon could be the boys mother.
- Similar prevalence of the stereotype among both men and women who responded.
- The bias could be alleviated by using gender-neutral language (replace "son" with "child").
- An example of *bias*.

Bias is a prejudice in favor of or against one thing, person, or group compared with another usually in a way that's considered to be unfair.

Implicit biases are social stereotypes about certain groups of people that individuals form outside their own conscious awareness. Everyone holds unconscious beliefs about various social and identity groups, and these biases stem from one's tendency to organize social worlds by categorizing.

Implicit bias is far more prevalent than conscious prejudice and often incompatible with one's conscious values. Certain scenarios can activate unconscious attitudes and beliefs. For example, **biases may be more prevalent when**

multi-tasking or working under time pressure.

A substantial amount of research has been published demonstrating **impact of implicit bias** in various domains including the **criminal justice system, education, and health/health care**. Bias may have an impact on: **hiring, and mentoring** and may contribute to healthcare disparities.

- 1. Awareness of one's implicit biases

- 2. Develop concern about the effects of bias

- 3. Self-regulatory Effort
 - a. Stereotype replacement, perspective taking, individuation, counterstereotypic imaging, and increasing opportunities for contact" *Breaking the prejudice habit*
