LAND ACKNOWLEDGEMENT

The land we work on is in Huichin (Xučyun), the ancestral and unceded territory of the Ohlone People.

We acknowledge the Chochenyo Ohlone people of the Bay Area and California, and recognize their continuing connection to land, waters and culture. We pay our respects to their Elders, past, present and emerging.

WHAT IS A LAND ACKNOWLEDGEMENT?

A land acknowledgement is a way of understanding and honoring the long-standing history that has led us to reside or work on the land, and to seek to understand our place in that history.

The land is a central part of who we all are, and this is honored and recognized in Native American cultures.

"It's a mixture of our blood, our past, our current, and our future. We carry our ancestors in us, and they're around us." - Mary Lyons (Leech Lake Band of Ojibwe)

INCLUDING A LAND ACKNOWLEDGEMENT

- Do a land acknowledgement for the right reasons to recognize and honor the Indigenous communities, and inspire others to do the same NOT out of a sense of guilt etc.
- Take the time to get the facts correct know the correct Indigenous group, the history of the land, and the correct pronunciation for all names (pronunciation guides are readily available online)
- · Use past, present *and* future tenses, and focus on a positive message
